



How much does it cost to send my child to St Brigid's School 2023

At St Brigid's School, like most schools (state/private), we receive most of our funding (93%) for each child from the Federal and State Governments. To enable St Brigid's to conduct our educational program effectively we operate a fee schedule for each student. We understand the financial pressure many of our families are under and are always trying to keep fees as low as possible.

School Fees:

Significant discounts for Health Care (HCC)/ Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holders and families.

Kindergarten: \$0 (3x full days: Mon, Weds, Thurs)

FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

Significant Fee Reductions for **HEALTH CARE CARD HOLDERS**
Inability to pay school fees is not a determining factor in enrolment acceptance. Parents experiencing difficulties in paying the school fees should contact the principal.

Levies:

Parents and Friends Levy (PP-6): \$100* per family per year

(Can be reduced to \$20 by volunteering at the school- \$10 per session)

Building Levy (PP-6): \$197 per family or \$90 for HCC/PCC

Amenities:

Amenities cover all additional expenses (except Year 5 and Year 6 camps) throughout the year including: compulsory insurance, IT Levy, photocopying, workbooks & textbooks, incursions/excursions (Including bus hire), classroom consumables, swimming lessons entry fee.

Kindy: \$120 (inc Booklist)

PP: \$375.60 (inc Booklist)

Y1-6 Student: \$425.60- \$598.85

Yr 5 Camp: \$200

Yr 6 Camp: \$470

HCC/PCC Discount \$180-\$220

Payments:

Amenities, Levies and Fees will be invoiced early Term 1 and can be paid via the following methods:

- Cash
- Cheque
- EFTPOS
- BPAY- (details on Family Statement issued each term)
- Direct Debit- (weekly/fortnightly/monthly etc) deducted automatically. Please contact the front desk to establish this payment system. Parents are welcome to make additional regular payments in allowance for uniform purchasing etc.
